Many grants span multiple themes. For example, some grants which are categorized under “Housing Vulnerability & Housing Veterans” also fund food security efforts among those communities and individuals. For this reason, we have categorized grants under their Primary Theme, but have provided Secondary Themes as well, to better understand the true impact of these funding endeavors.



Food Security

Between March 20, 2020 and March 20, 2021 the Community Response Team dispensed 31 grants toward strengthening food security in Humboldt, Trinity, Del Norte and Curry Counties, totalling \$360,961.

Food has been one of the major needs of the region, as economic insecurity and sheltering in place guidelines for those who are most vulnerable prevented access to vital resources. Requests ranged widely, from culturally appropriate food boxes for Hmong people in Del Norte County, to the initiation of a new farm on Karuk lands for ensuring accessibility of appropriate nutrition into the future. Additionally, the Community Response Team sought to strengthen and ensure the continuation of food pantries throughout the region, who provide nutritious food for countless people. The Community Response Team also wanted to join regional partners in thinking proactively about food security going forward, and helped to fund a Coordinated North Coast emergency food response program. Housing Vulnerability & Housing Veterans

Between March 20, 2020 and March 20, 2021, the Community Response Team distributed 31 grants toward Housing Vulnerability & Housing Veterans totalling \$385,735.

After Food Security, Housing Vulnerability & Housing Veterans was by far the next highest need for our region during the pandemic. Some needs were immediate, such as the need for temporary housing for shelters that could not abide by social distancing mandates. Other needs were operational, such as continuing mobile showers and food drives for unhoused individuals during a time where resources were limited. Native American/Racial Health & Economic Disparities

Between March 20, 2020 and March 20, 2021 the Community Response Team distributed 23 grants toward Native American/Racial Health & Economic Disparities totalling \$251,500.

Throughout the service area, Humboldt Area Foundation and Wild Rivers Community Foundation surfaced what other communities are discovering as the pandemic unfolds. Socio-economic, political and financial variables connected to race and historical oppressions are factoring into disproportionate consequences. During listening sessions, the Community Response Team was asked to support Indigenous and other communities of color at unprecedented rates- by providing functional, logical, targeted support during the initial rounds of funding.

Children & Adult Education

Between March 20, 2020 and March 20, 2021, the Community Response Team distributed 22 grants toward Children & Adult Education totalling \$178,421.

Listening sessions conducted by the Community Response Team revealed that the health, mental health and overall wellbeing of children and students rose to the top of lists of needs as a result of the impact of the pandemic. As schools went to remote operations, some children faced barriers to success with a lack of technology, connectivity and mental health support resources. Many students, some of whom with special needs, still required face-to-face contact with educators necessitating additional PPE, outdoor equipment and other tools for the safety of the student as well as the educator. Additional barriers were identified for DACA* students, some of whom did not qualify for stimulus or any additional support, and found it very difficult to stay in higher education. First Responders & Essential Workers

Between March 20, 2020 and March 20, 2021 the Community Response Team distributed 20 grants toward First Responders & Essential Workers totalling \$269,804.

The COVID-19 pandemic put severe strain and stress on local first responders and essential workers, who were responding to a heightened number of crises and maintaining infrastructure such as food security, health, mental health, education and many other necessary societal structures while needing to maintain their own individual health and safety as well. The need to care for first responders and essential workers was further heightened when, in both California and Oregon, wildfires raged, unhousing and putting further individuals, families and entire communities at even higher risk. This theme covers PPE, ambulance repair, appreciation campaigns and even administrative costs for local nonprofits and health care workers who helped to maintain the resilience of our rural region. Between March 20, 2020 and March 20, 2021 the Community Response Team distributed 19 grants toward Health/Mental Health & Hygiene totalling \$307,820.

Our rural region experiences a lack of both mental health services and infrastructure for preventative care. Instead, there is reactionary, limited and inconsistent health care infrastructure due to the lack of retention of all medical personnel, but more of all retention of specialists and nurses. During the pandemic this was felt more deeply by the people who live in this region. As health and mental health needs were exacerbated, grants were distributed to help fill in the gaps. Connectivity & Technology

Between March 20, 2020 and March 20, 2021 the Community Response Team distributed 16 grants toward Connectivity & Technology, totalling \$143,950.

As many nonprofits and schools shifted toward remote operations, a major gap presented itself in technological tools that helped to maintain consistency in providing services and education. The Community Response Team, with major help and funding from an Anonymous Donor, stepped forward and helped to provide iPads, Chromebooks, hotspots and more to help fill in the technological gaps. Additionally, the Community Response Team learned that local media, struggling to make ends meet during the pandemic, is vital to the community in providing information that is relevant and reliable. For this reason, a grant was provided to Access Humboldt to support the Community Voices Coalition, a major effort of the North Coast Journal in providing accurate and timely information about the impact of the pandemic on the people who live here. **DACA- Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals, a term used for migrant populations who arrived in the United States as children who qualify for specialized programs.*
